Physical toll of recovering from COVID-19 should not leave a lifetime of mental health scars Panhandle total: 369, Active: 69, Recovered: 295, Deaths: 5

The COVID-19 pandemic is stressful for people. Fear and anxiety about what can happen is overwhelming and causes strong emotions in children and adults.

The important prevention strategies like social distancing, can make people feel isolated and lonely but remain critical to reducing the spread. Coping with stress in a healthy way will make you, the people you care about, and your community stronger.

Some people in the Panhandle that have been confirmed with COVID-19 have been subjected to threats and other concerning bullying behaviors. Modeling kindness for children is key as we are nearing the start of school and to help lessen physical and emotional anxiety.

Unified Command confirms four more cases of COVID-19 in the Panhandle:

Scotts Bluff	Male in his 40s	Close Contact

The investigations are complete, all close contacts will be quarantined and actively monitored twice daily for fever and respiratory symptoms by public health officials.

One new recovery in Kimball County brings the total recoveries to 295.
