You can catch COVID-19 no matter how sunny or hot the weather is Panhandle total: 419, Active: 63, Recovered: 350, Deaths: 6

A myth about heat killing the COVID-19 virus continues to be shared. The fact is, you can catch COVID-19 no matter how sunny or hot the weather is. Countries and states with hot weather have reported cases of COVID-19.

Unified Command confirms four more cases of COVID-19 in the Panhandle:

County	Demographics	Exposure Type
Cheyenne	Female in her 20s	Close Contact
Scotts Bluff	Female in her teens	Close Contact
Scotts Bluff	Male in his 30s	Unknown
Scotts Bluff	Male in his 50s	Community Spread

The investigations are underway, all close contacts will be quarantined and actively monitored twice daily for fever and respiratory symptoms by public health officials.

One new recovery in Scotts Bluff County brings the total recoveries to 350.
