Governor's Directed Health Measure moving to phase four tomorrow, September 11 Panhandle total: 730, Active: 84, Recovered: 640, Deaths: 6

As we move into phase four of the Governor's Directed Health Measure beginning tomorrow, September 11, the following sections will be updated to guidance and use is recommended:

- Bars & Restaurants
- Childcare Facilities
- Churches
- Gyms/Fitness Centers/Health Clubs/Health Spas
- Salons/Barber Shops/Massage Therapy Services/Tattoo Parlors
- Sports
- Wedding & Funeral Reception Venues

Indoor gatherings are at 75% of rated occupancy and outdoor at 100% of rated occupancy. Plans for reopening or expanding to new capacity limits must be submitted on Panhandle Public Health District's website at: <a href="http://pphd.org/COVID-19.html">http://pphd.org/COVID-19.html</a>.
