## Governor's Directed Health Measure does not change the Long-term Care COVID Phasing Guidance

## Panhandle total: 794, Active: 92, Recovered: 694, Deaths: 8

The Governor's Directed Health Measure does not change the Long-term Care COVID Phasing Guidance issued by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS). The mitigation efforts that have been put in place remain critically important, especially in long-term care settings where residents may be more vulnerable to virus exposure. Facilities are working hard to balance staff and resident safety and precautions with expectations of the resident's loved ones. If you have a loved one in a facility, be sure to call before going to stay up-to-date on which phase they are in for resident safety and what ways are offered to connect with your loved one.

Unified Command confirms 38 more cases of COVID in the Panhandle since last reporting on Monday, September 14. The investigations are underway, all close contacts will be quarantined and actively monitored for symptoms by public health officials.
