We all play a part to ensure our loved ones, friends, and neighbors have what they need to feel safe and supported during COVID

In our Panhandle communities, we all play a part to ensure our loved ones, friends, and neighbors have what they need to feel safe and supported during COVID. Even though direct contact isn't possible when someone has been confirmed COVID positive, it doesn't mean we can't still help with their healing.

When a person is isolating at home due to COVID, they are staying home and away from others to heal but also not spread the virus. They need our critical support to recover physically and mentally. Even small steps to help each other are an important reminder of how we can all get through it together.

Ways we can safely support others in our community when they are recovering from the COVID virus:

- Ask if you can leave groceries or a meal on their porch.
- Drop off books, crossword puzzles, coloring books, or other items to help pass the time.
- Ask if you can run a simple errand or complete a task for them like mowing their yard.
- Schedule time for a virtual chat or phone call to check in on them or send them a text
 whenever you can to let them know you support them and wish them well with their
 recovery.
- Leave a note on their door or window sharing encouraging words.
- Understand the COVID recovery criteria* and once a disease investigator has confirmed
 the persons' recovery status, they are able to go out and about safely without concern
 for spreading the virus. They are no longer contagious and need your support now more
 than ever by listening to their experience and practicing kindness.

*A person is considered recovered from COVID after they have reached the following criteria and have been contacted by a disease investigator to confirm recovery status:

- No fever for at least 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication; AND,
- Other symptoms have improved; AND,
- At least 10 days have passed since symptoms first appeared.

Unified Command confirms 35 more cases of COVID in the Panhandle since last reporting on Monday, September 21. The investigations are underway, all close contacts will be quarantined and actively monitored for symptoms by public health officials.
