Panhandle COVID-19 Unified Command Announces Locations of Potential Community Exposure from Recently Confirmed Case in Scotts Bluff County

With the recent announcement of a COVID-19 positive case in Scotts Bluff County, further information is being shared with the public to limit the spread. This case has been determined to be community spread, someone who has been infected but health officials aren't sure where or how.

If you visited any of the following locations at any of the dates and times listed below and are <u>not showing symptoms</u>, please self-quarantine and monitor your symptoms for 14 days from your most recent visit to one of the locations below.

If you are <u>showing symptoms</u> (fever, sore throat, cough, or shortness of breath), please contact your healthcare provider or public health. **Please call before going to any healthcare facility.** Visit <u>www.pphd.org</u> for self-quarantine guidance.
